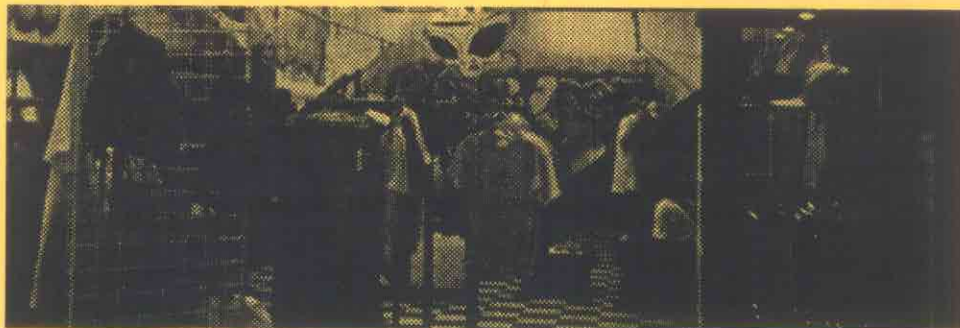

He spoke about PLUR and other positive things. But it was when I received a small piece of paper that I decided to write you this letter. I read it on the long journey home, and it almost brought tears to my eyes.

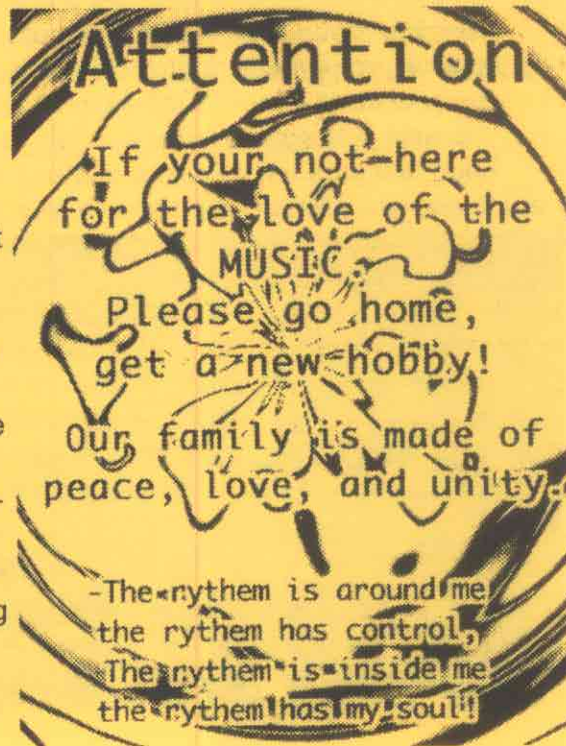

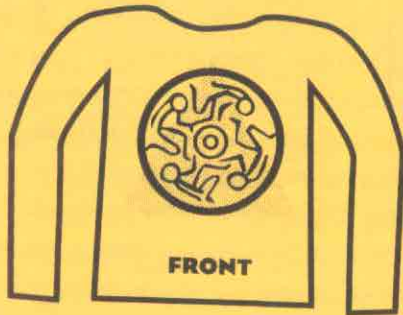
